UPDATE: MASS ATTENDANCE AND GROUP MEETINGS.

Effective June 15, 2020, Bishop Guglielmone has given parishes permission to increase our allowable capacity to 50 % for Masses. This increased capacity must comply with all guidelines previously established and continue the requisite social distancing to ensure the safety of all present. Dr. Joseph Johnson is a resident of Greenwood, SC with his wife Toby, daughter Abi, and son Benji. Raised in the Baptist tradition, in his search for Truth, he spent time in Messianic Jewish synagogues. After entering Erskine Theological Seminary, he embraced the Presbyterian wing of the Reformation. He spent 4 1/2 years as the pastor of Rock Presbyterian Church (Greenwood, SC) but in his liturgical studies, he began to drift toward Catholicism. He and his wife, both graduates from Emmanuel College in Georgia, taught in a Christian school and enrolled in Seminary at Luskine. It is there that Dr. Johnson completed both a Master of Divinity and a Master of Arts Theological Studies degree. In the middle of his doctoral studies, he resigned from his pastorate and he and Toby began RCIA in the Fall of 2012 at Our Lady of Lourdes in Greenwood. They entered the Church at Easter 2013. Toby successfully homeschooled their daughter to graduation and is homeschooling their son Benji. He currently serves as the Director of Christian Formation at Our Lady of Lourdes.

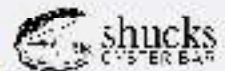
