2. The RE Corner with Jan Heithaus: Our next daughter virtue is adoration. To "adjure" a person is to put him under oath, that is, to require an oath from him. Thus the high priest required our Lord to swear that He is the Christ (Matt. 26:63): "I adjure thee by the living God that thou tell us whether thou art the Christ, the Son of God." Since it is lawful, on due conditions, to swear, it cannot be unlawful, when occasion warrants and jurisdiction exists, to demand an oath of another. In a court of law, for example, a witness is lawfully adjured, that is, he is required to swear before God that he will give full and true testimony.

It is a kind of adjuring to induce or command anyone to do a thing in the name of God. In this sense, evil spirits are adjured in exorcisms. (catholictheology.info)
