## PASTOR'S CORNER

### SAINT WHO?

#### Saints Who Served in Times of Plague and Pandemic

Since ancient times, plague, pandemic, and contagion have divided the human race. On the one side are those who are afflicted with a deadly disease. On the other side are the healthy who, in their fear of contagion, push the stricken as far from them as they can. The *leper*, the Book of Leviticus says, *shall dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp* (13:46).

Thus, nothing strikes us so much about this month's saints and blessed as their intense *attachment* to the abandoned sick. Blessed Jan Beyzym speaks for all of them when, on his way to the lepers of Madagascar, he writes, "I know very well what leprosy is and what I must expect, but all this does not frighten me. On the contrary, it attracts me." What can explain a man's attraction to the leper whose body is rotting, whose putrid scent drives all from his path?

The answer is to be found in another Man, who for our sake willingly became one spurned and avoided by men...one of those from whom men hide their faces (Is 53:3). Christ, the suffering Servant, has made himself one with the abandoned and the rejected. And in drawing close to Christ, the saints have embraced his dear companions, the outcasts. They encourage us to do the same. As Pope Francis often says, "Go to the margins!"

#### Our first Saint Who Served in Times of Plague and Pandemic:

##### **Saint Joseph Cottolengo**

(Founder + 1842)

Feast: April 30

Joseph was born in Bra, Piedmont, Italy, the eldest of twelve children. Like his mother, Joseph had a heart for the poor and the sick. Once, when he was five, he went about measuring the family home to see how many sickbeds it could accommodate.

Joseph became a priest and was eventually assigned to the cathedral in Turin. One day he heard of a French family that had stopped in the city on their travels. The pregnant mother was suffering from tuberculosis, and no hospital would take her in. Joseph attended the woman as she died and comforted her grieving husband and children. From this time, Joseph knew he must give his life for the abandoned of society. He rented some rooms near the basilica, and the poor and the sick came in droves. Young women also came to help. When a cholera epidemic swept through the city, pressure mounted on Joseph to close his rooms. This became the incentive for a move to a new site on the margins of the city, where he founded the first "Little House of Providence" in 1832. The woman helpers, now called the Sisters of St. Vincent de Paul, were joined by lay brothers and a priests' branch.

In all things, Joseph drew strength from the Eucharist, our Lady, and his order's patron saint St. Vincent de Paul. He died of typhoid in 1842 and was canonized in 1934.

**Watching a video on your TV:**

1. Make sure your streaming device (Roku, Apple TV, Firestick, Chromecast) is on and connected to the internet.
2. Open the Chosen app on your phone & select your video.
3. Press the 'Send To TV' button or the "cast icon" in the top right corner & select your device.
4. Press play.

**If you're having any trouble:**

1. Make sure your phone & device are connected to the same Wi-Fi.
2. Close & reopen your app.
3. Ensure your app is updated (go to the app store to check).
4. Press the 'Send To TV' button or cast icon, select "Can't find your device?" and go through the steps.
5. Go to thechosen.tv and click the help icon in the bottom right corner.

Hope this helps! And please know our engineering team works around the clock to improve your experience, so it'll only get better.

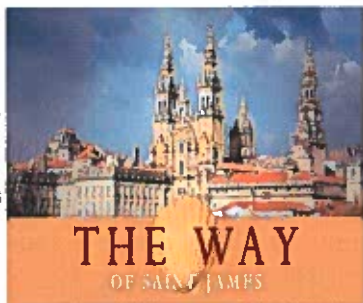

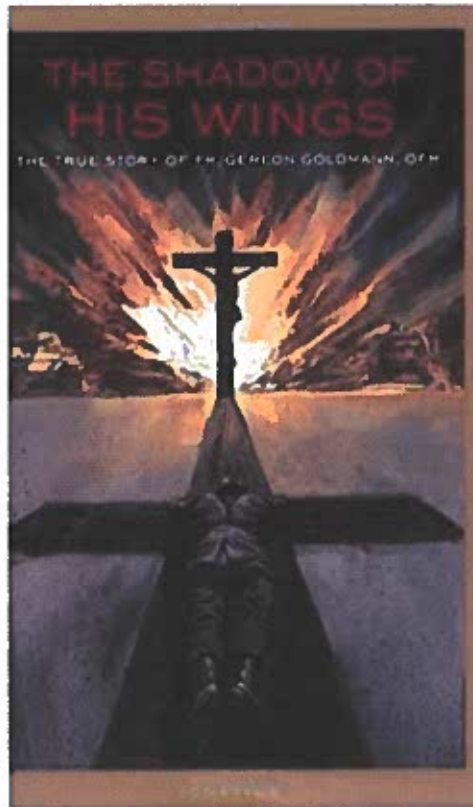
### Our Speakers Series Welcomes Deacon Chet Johns
