At 10 weeks, the baby is about 3 cm long. The heart is fully developed with 4 separate chambers. The baby’s heart is beating around 180 beats per minute. All of the baby’s organs and basic framework have formed and the embryo is now called a fetus. In the fetal stage, the fully formed organs and systems are rapidly growing and developing. This week the baby’s bones of the knees, elbows, wrists and ankles are developing, and facial features are becoming more distinct as the jawbone is taking shape.
