PASTOR'S CORNER

From the teachings of Saint Dorotheus, abbot

(Doct. 13, De accusatione sui ipsius, 2-3: PG 88, 1699)

On false spiritual peace

The man who finds fault with himself accepts all things cheerfully – misfortune, loss, disgrace, dishonor and any other kind of adversity. He believes that he is deserving of all these things and nothing can disturb him. No one could be more at peace than this man.

But perhaps you will offer me this objection: "Suppose my brother injures me, and on examining myself I find that I have not given him any cause. Why should I blame myself?"

Certainly if someone examines himself carefully and with fear of God, he will never find himself completely innocent. He will see that he has given some provocation by an action, a word or by his manner. If he does find that he is not guilty in any of these ways, certainly he must have injured that brother somehow at some other time. Or perhaps he has been a source of annoyance to some other brother. For this reason he deserves to endure the injury because of many other sins that he has committed on other occasions.

Someone else asks why he should accuse himself when he was sitting peacefully and quietly when a brother came upon him with an unkind or insulting word. He cannot tolerate it, and so he thinks that his anger is justified. If that brother had not approached him and said those words and upset him, he never would have sinned.

This kind of thinking is surely ridiculous and has no rational basis. For the fact that he has said anything at all in this situation breaks the cover on the passionate anger within him, which is all the more exposed by his excessive anxiety. If he wished, he would do penance. He has become like a clean, shiny grain of wheat that, when broken, is full of dirt inside.

The man who thinks that he is quiet and peaceful has within him a passion that he does not see. A brother comes up, utters some unkind word and immediately all the venom and mire that lie hidden within him are spewed out. If he wishes mercy, he must do penance, purify himself and strive to become perfect. He will see that he should have returned thanks to his brother instead of returning the injury, because his brother has proven to be an occasion of profit to him. It will not be long before he will no longer be bothered by these temptations. The more perfect he grows, the less these temptations will affect him. For the more the soul advances, the stronger and more powerful it becomes in bearing the difficulties that it meets.



Brown Scapular enrollment

What is the Brown Scapular?

Sunday, July 14 at 12:30pm



Why should we wear it?
What does it mean to be enrolled in it?

The Brown Scapular is a powerful sacramental; it is a sign of devotion to Mary and a pledge of her maternal protection. It is a sign of our commitment to our Catholic faith.

The brown scapular we currently use came from the "monastic scapular", part of the habit of most religious orders, which is a long length of cloth suspended both front and back from the shoulders of the wearer and originally served as aprons for medieval monks. It was customary, especially during the Middle Ages, "for laypeople who belonged to confraternities, sodalities or third orders affiliated with religious orders to wear some sign of membership, usually derived from the religious habit such as a cord, cloak or scapular." In time, as more and more lay people wanted affiliation with the Carmelite Order and its spirituality, the size of the scapular was reduced, making the "devotional scapular" easy for anyone wishing to do so, to wear it over their shoulders under their clothing.

Any baptized Catholic can be invested in the Confraternity of the Brown Scapular by a Catholic priest, which usually takes place during a short ceremony. Investiture in the Brown Scapular needs to be done only once. After that investiture, one may wear any scapular without it having to be blessed.

The Brown Scapular is not a magical charm to protect you. It is not an automatic guarantee of salvation. It is not an excuse for not living up to the demands of the Christian life. Rather, in wearing the Scapular, one is obligated to show a sincere commitment in following Jesus through the example of Mary, which means more than the occasional prayer in her honor.

"It is a permanent way of Christian living, made up of prayer and the interior life, frequent recourse to the sacraments and the concrete exercise of the corporal and spiritual works of mercy" (St. Pope John Paul II).

Scapulars will be available for purchase (\$10) after all Masses beginning June 29th/30th.





At 14 weeks, the baby is about 8.5cm long, about the size of an orange. They are now wiggling their toes, moving their arms and legs, sucking their thumb, and turning their head from side to side. The head is more round and more in proportion with the rest of the body. The baby may also be making facial expressions. The kidneys are making urine, and the liver and spleen are functioning. This week, the baby is growing lanugo, a thin, peach fuzz-like hair all over, which will help keep their body warm.
