PASTOR'S CORNER

From the book of the prophet Ezekiel

36:16-28

I shall pour clean water upon you, and I shall give you a new heart

Thus the word of the Lord came to me: Son of man, when the house of Israel lived in their land, they defiled it by their conduct and deeds. Therefore I poured out my fury upon them (because of the blood which they poured out on the ground, and because they defiled it with idols). I scattered them among the nations, dispersing them over foreign lands; according to their conduct and deeds I judged them. But when they came among the nations (wherever they came), they served to profane my holy name, because it was said of them: "These are the people of the Lord, yet they had to leave their land." So I have relented because of my holy name which the house of Israel profaned among the nations where they came.

Therefore say to the house of Israel: Thus says the Lord God: Not for your sakes do I act, house of Israel, but for the sake of my holy name, which you profaned among the nations to which you came. I will prove the holiness of my great name, profaned among the nations, in whose midst you have profaned it. Thus the nations shall know that I am the Lord, says the Lord God, when in their sight I prove my holiness through you.

For I will take you away from among the nations, gather you from all the foreign lands, and bring you back to your own land. I will sprinkle clean water upon you to cleanse you from all your impurities, and from all your idols I will cleanse you.

I will give you a new heart and place a new spirit within you, taking from your bodies your stony hearts and giving you natural hearts. I will put my spirit within you and make you live by my statutes, careful to observe my decrees. You shall live in the land I gave your fathers; you shall be my people, and I will be your God.

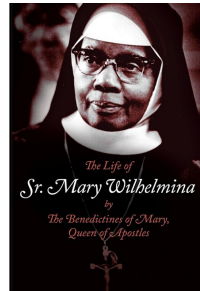

Sister Mary Wilhelmina Lancaster, OSB, founded the Benedictine Sisters of Mary, Queen of Apostles in 1995 at the age of seventy.

Four years after her death, in May 2023, the sisters were preparing for the reinterment of the remains of their beloved foundress. Upon seeing Sister Mary's remains, they discovered something incredible—her body appeared to be incorrupt!

In The Life of Sister Mary Wilhelmina, you will become acquainted with this most humble sister, who, after fifty years of religious life, was called to establish the Benedictines of Mary, Queen of Apostles, to remain faithful to the traditional religious life and the Latin Mass. This biography includes stories of her life, her experience as a Black Catholic during racial tensions, the founding of a community, and her original poetry. Her entire life is a testament to fidelity, devotion, and surrender to God's will.

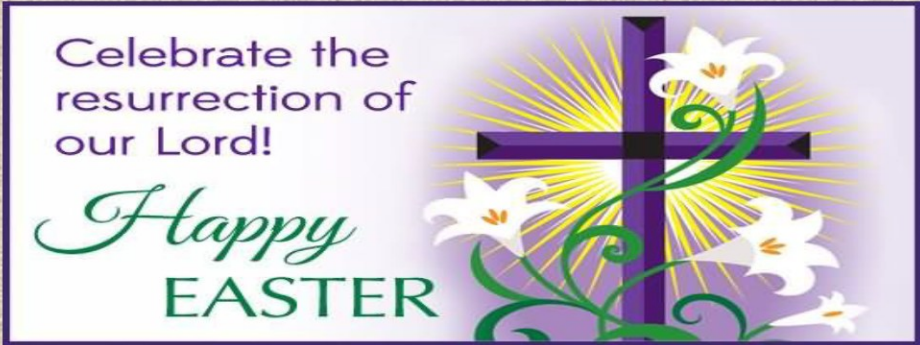

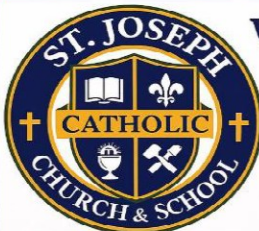

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This month, we live the Paschal Triduum, the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. As we seek to deepen our relationship with Jesus, I encourage you to partake in this month's activity for *Via Fidelis*: "Ask someone of a different age or background about their experiences growing up Catholic." But it's more than just that. It is asking another person how they have encountered Jesus and how it affected their lives.

We each share a unique view of Christ through our experiences with him — but he is the same Lord. On Palm Sunday, a throng of impassioned followers of Jesus welcomed him joyfully into Jerusalem. They saw a prophet, a wellspring of the knowledge of God and the law, riding on a donkey. When he was presented before that same crowd, jeering and rejecting him, Pontius Pilate looked on the Lord with fear, curiosity and even guilt. So follow Jesus with conviction, not emotion.

The women of Jerusalem, and Veronica who wiped his bloody face, saw Jesus through the eyes of compassion. Like her, we are called to be compassionate to the needs of others. Even Simon of Cyrene looked quickly at the Son of God before his cross was thrust onto his shoulders to bear.

Jesus manifests himself in our lives at different moments. Sometimes we forget that we are not the center of the universe. We focus inwardly so often, yet the most important moments of our lives can be found outwardly in the smallest, quietest, most mundane daily things, like the smile of a stranger or the kindness of a good deed. And Jesus most clearly shows himself to us in Mass, where that same sacrifice of his crucifixion in the elevated host makes us proclaim, "my Lord and my God" (Jn 20:28).

I invite you to exit your comfort zone and discuss this aspect of the faith with a sibling, a friend, a stranger, a coworker or a grandparent. Thank you for sparking these important conversations. Like mustard seeds, our own understanding can be grown through dialogue with others about the beauty of our faith.

SCRIPTURE

Read: Malachi 3:6-12

REFLECT:

1. In this passage, the Lord, through the prophet Malachi, contrasts his own unchanging character with the changing affections and varying fidelity of his people. How is this perhaps reflected in our own experiences?
2. The Lord also accuses his people of robbing him by refusing to support the Temple through tithes. Do you think there is more to this accusation than simply monetary concerns? How might this be applicable in our own time?
3. This passage ends with a promise for prosperity at least in terms of agricultural abundance. What does it mean to trust in God's promises? What happens when God fulfills promises in a way or in a timeframe that differs from our expectations?

READ: A selection from *Via Fidelis* — Chapter 4

God, however, is the author of all things, and he is unchanging. As the prophet Malachi gives witness: "For I the Lord do not change" (3:6). And God desires to teach us so that we can know him and his way, as the Lord Jesus told us: "The Advocate, the holy Spirit that the Father will send in my name — he will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you" (Jn 14:26). By knowing the Lord's unchanging truth, he becomes a rock and fortress for us, as the Psalmist sings: *Lord, my rock, my fortress, my deliverer, My God, my rock of refuge, my shield, my saving horn, my stronghold!* (Ps 18:2)

We cannot love what we do not know. We cannot give to others what we ourselves do not have. And so, we must be true disciples and learn from the Lord. We must let him teach us and show us his way. We are called to trust him and accept his divine guidance and love. As Christians, we must be vigilant and alert, so as not to be caught off-guard (see 1 Pt 5:8). We need to stay close to the Lord and let his teachings be a lamp to our feet (see Ps 119:105).

As the Lord Jesus says to us: "If you remain in my word, you will truly be my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free" (Jn 8:31-32). While the faithful must be attentive to the fallen world around them, the *Via Fidelis* is not the way of paranoia, fear, repression or misery. It is the way of prudence, filial boldness, freedom and joy! We cannot know this way unless we know Jesus Christ and accept him as our teacher, prophet and companion.

REFLECT:

1. This selection begins with an appeal to the passage from Malachi that we discussed. What does it say about how we place our trust in God?
2. In this selection, the bishop emphasizes that we cannot give what we do not have. What do you think this means and what are the implications of this for our lives?
3. In this selection, while urging us toward vigilance, the bishop also emphasizes that the "faithful way" is a way of "prudence, filial boldness, freedom and joy" and not one of "paranoia, fear, repression or misery." How can we embody this in our way of life?

**TREASURY OF THE CHURCH:
THE DEPOSIT OF FAITH**

*Read the Catechism of the Catholic Church
50-53, 68-69, 76, 80-83, 97, 105-108, 135-136*

- Divine Revelation is transmitted to us through Apostolic Tradition:
 - Apostolic Tradition is the communication of Christ's message, beginning with the Apostles, who entrusted all they received from Christ and the Holy to the Church
- Apostolic Tradition is transmitted through sacred Scripture and sacred Tradition
- Together, Scripture and Tradition form the one "Deposit of Faith"
- God is the author of sacred Scripture, which is written by human authors under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit
- Both the Old and New Testaments form the canon of sacred Scripture and together communicate God's plan of salvation for the World
- The Old Testament prepares for the New Testament while the New Testament fulfils the Old Testament
- In addition to the written words of Scripture, the Apostolic Tradition is also communicated through the living transmission of faith, which we refer to as "Tradition" or "Sacred Tradition"
- Both Scripture and Tradition communicate the Word of God and are rooted the Gospel Proclamation (*kerygma*)

DEFINE: PASCHAL TRIDUUM

We use the term Triduum to refer to the three-day period of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday which culminates with the celebration of the East Vigil. In a special way, the whole Church enters into Christ's Paschal mystery of his passion and resurrection. We use the term paschal, meaning Passover, because Christ's saving death and resurrection fulfill all of God's saving work in the Old Testament, of which the Passover of Exodus has a special place even as it is practiced in Judaism today. The Paschal Triduum is considered the high point of the Liturgical Year.

APRIL 2: HOLY THURSDAY

On Holy Thursday, we celebrate the Last Supper during which the Eucharist was instituted as Jesus' Paschal sacrifice. It is sometimes referred to as Maundy Thursday. *Maundy* comes from the Latin *mandatum* (command), referring to the "new commandment" Jesus gives at the Last Supper shortly after washing his disciples' feet. This command is "to love one another as he has loved us" (Jn 13:34-35). After this celebration, the Eucharistic Prayer is not prayed again until the Easter Vigil.

APRIL 3: GOOD FRIDAY

We refer to Good Friday as "good" because of the goodness of Jesus' complete gift of self on the cross. At the celebration of the Lord's passion, the Eucharist is distributed, but Mass is not offered.

APRIL 4: HOLY SATURDAY

A day of silence, Holy Saturday is meant to be an opportunity to enter into the mystery of Christ's with hopeful expectation. The feeling of absence, that comes from the lack of daily Mass being offered, points us to the reality of Christ's death — in turn, it means that his resurrection is also real.

APRIL 4: THE EASTER VIGIL

Our celebration of Easter begins at sundown on Holy Saturday with the Easter Vigil. In this celebration, we experience the light of Christ and recall God's saving work throughout all of "salvation history" through the readings. As we recall God's saving work and will that find the fullest expression in Christ himself and the Paschal mystery, this celebration is a time when new Christians join Christ in his death and resurrection through baptism.

APRIL 25: ST. MARK THE EVANGELIST

Early Christian writers tell us that St. Mark, the evangelist behind the Gospel of Mark, was a companion of St. Peter, and his account of Jesus' ministry is possibly that of St. Peter. St. Mark's remains are currently thought to be in the city of Venice. The winged lion often used to represent Mark's Gospel in iconography is the symbol of the city of Venice.

What is Active Member Status in the Parish?

Active member status means that the person is:

- Registered in the parish
- Attends Mass weekly
- Supports the Parish through the consistent giving of time, talent, and/or financial resources in support of our Parish

Why should a person have Active Member Status in our Parish?

Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- Parishioner tuition in the school
- Attendance in Religious Education classes
- Letter of Eligibility to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation (see additional conditions below)
- Reception of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, or Marriage at our Church (unless specific permission is given)

What are the requirements for being a Sacramental Sponsor (Godparent or Confirmation Sponsor)?

To be eligible to be a sacramental sponsor, a person must:

- Be a Catholic who has received the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation. If these sacraments were not received at our Church, must provide a sacramental record from the Church of Baptism with Parish seal.
- Marital status of single or married according to the laws of the Catholic Church
- Have Active Member Status in the Parish as outlined above

Is my Marriage Recognized by the Church?

Like other couples in your parish or family, you may be wondering if your marriage is fully recognized by the Catholic Church. Catholic Church law ordinarily requires baptized Roman Catholics to marry before a priest or deacon. Unless they received a **“dispensation from canonical form,”** Catholics who exchange vows in the presence of ministers from other religious traditions or civil officials are not considered validly married in the eyes of the Catholic Church.

Regardless of what happened in the past, the Catholic Church invites you to bring new meaning to your lives by embracing the vocation of marriage and dedicating your family’s mission to sharing God’s love.

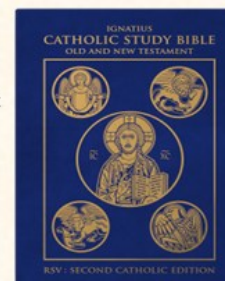
