**PASTOR'S CORNER**

**From a Treatise on the Lord's Prayer by Saint Cyprian, bishop and martyr  
(Nn. 4-6: CSEL 3, 268-270) *Let your prayer come from a humble heart***

When we pray, our words should be calm, modest and disciplined. Let us reflect that we are standing before God. We should please him both by our bodily posture and the manner of our speech. It is characteristic of the vulgar to shout and make a noise, not those who are modest. On the contrary, they should employ a quiet tone in their prayer.

Moreover, in the course of his teaching, the Lord instructed us to pray in secret. Hidden and secluded places, even our own rooms, give witness to our belief that God is present everywhere; that he sees and hears all; that in the fullness of his majesty, he penetrates hidden and secret places. This is the teaching of Jeremiah: *Am I God when I am near, and not God when I am far away? Can anyone hide in a dark corner without my seeing him? Do I not fill heaven and earth?* Another passage of Scripture says: *The eyes of the Lord are everywhere, observing both good and wicked men.*

The same modesty and discipline should characterize our liturgical prayer as well. When we gather to celebrate the divine mysteries with God's priest, we should not express our prayer in unruly words; the petition that should be made to God with moderation is not to be shouted out noisily and verbosely. For God hears our heart not our voice. He sees our thoughts; he is not to be shouted at. The Lord showed us this when he asked: *Why do you think evil in your hearts?* The book of Revelation testifies to this also: *And all the churches shall know that I am the one who searches the heart and the desires.*

Anna maintained this rule; in her observance of it she is an image of the Church. In the First Book of Kings we are told that she prayed quietly and modestly to God in the recesses of her heart. Her prayer was secret but her faith was evident. She did not pray with her voice, but with her heart, for she knew that in this way the Lord would hear her. She prayed with faith and obtained what she sought. Scripture makes this clear in the words: *She was speaking in her heart; her lips were moving but her voice could not be heard; and the Lord heard her prayer.* The psalmist also reminds us: *Commune within your own hearts, and in the privacy of your room express your remorse.* This is the teaching of the Holy Spirit. Through Jeremiah he suggests this: *Say in your hearts: Lord, it is you that we have to worship.*

My friends, anyone who worships should remember the way in which the tax-collector prayed in the temple alongside the Pharisee. He did not raise his eyes immodestly to heaven or lift up his hands arrogantly. Instead he struck his breast and confessing the sins hidden within his heart he implored the assistance of God's mercy. While the Pharisee was pleased with himself, the tax-collector deserved to be cleansed much more because of the manner in which he prayed. For he did not place his hope of salvation in the certainty of his own innocence; indeed, no one is innocent. Rather he prayed humbly, confessing his sins. And the Lord who forgives the lowly heard his prayer.

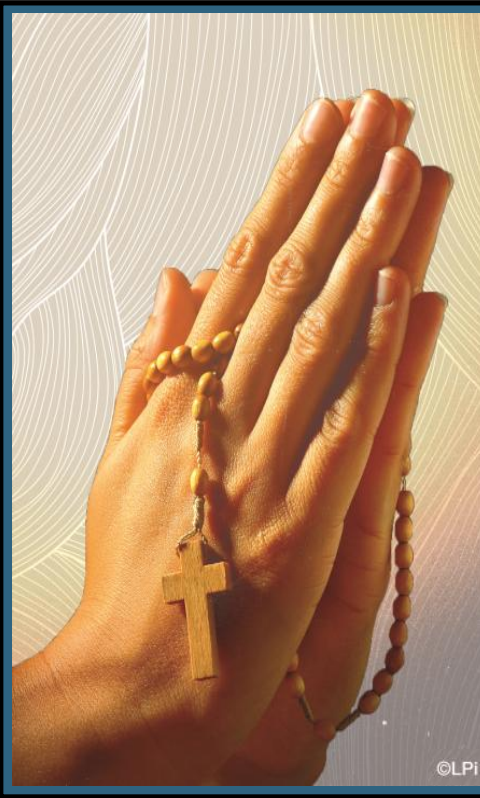

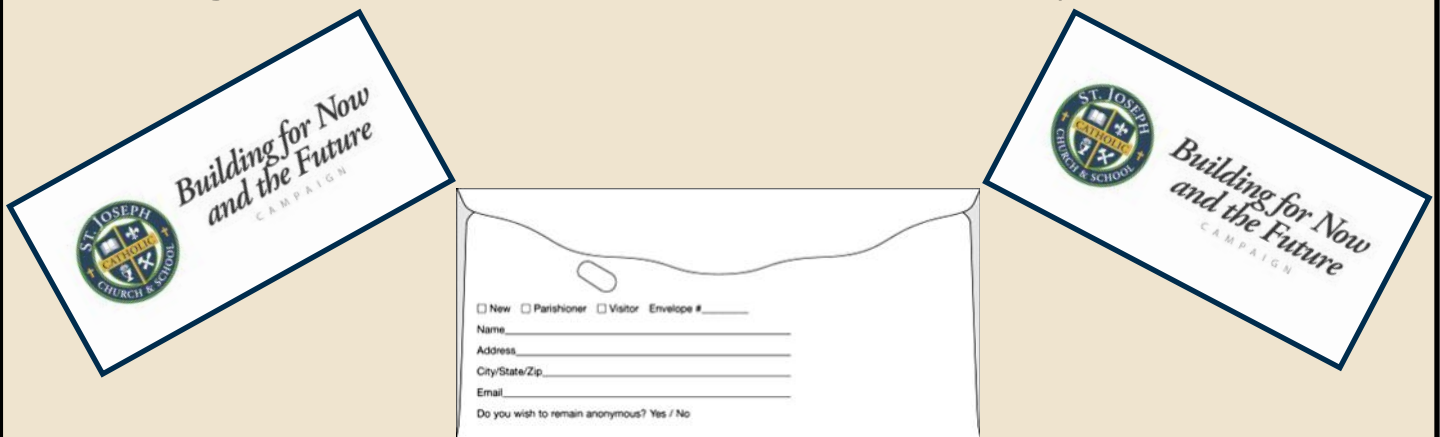

### READ: A selection from *Via Fidelis* – Communion of Saints (pg. 28)

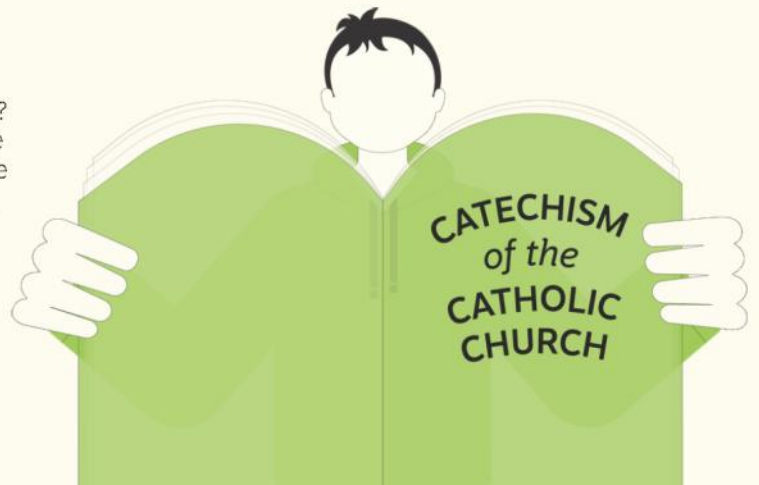
On the *Via Fidelis*, we are accompanied by "a great cloud of witnesses," the saints of the church (see Heb 12:1). As we work to learn and share the truths of our faith, we are helped by many heavenly brothers and sisters who befriend us, intercede for us and help us.

Generations of saints have given witness to the Holy Trinity, to the Lord Jesus, his life and teachings and his saving death and resurrection. Many martyrs have heroically given their lives rather than abandon or misstate the teachings of the Gospel.

We are all called to welcome the witness of the holy ones and to share in their level of zeal and burning love for the Lord Jesus and his Church.

### REFLECT:

1. This selection begins with the image of witnesses from Hebrews. Why is the intercession of the canonized saints such an important element of the Christian life?
2. How does the fact that many martyrs have given their lives for the faith affect how we view and appreciate that faith?
3. How can we imitate and share the zeal of the saints?

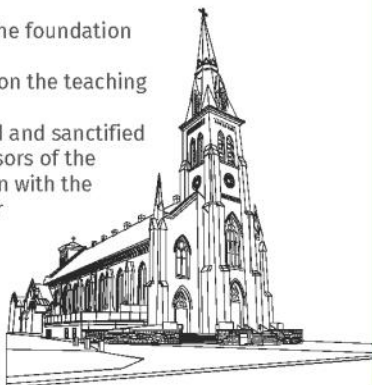

**WHAT IS THE CHURCH? AND THE "MARKS" OF THE CHURCH**

Read the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*  
751-752, 770-780, 804, 813-816, 823-829, 830-831, 857, 861-870

- The Church is the people called and gathered together by God
- The Church is referred to as a "mystery" because she has a divine spiritual reality active alongside her visible reality
- The Church is described in the Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed as characterized by four "marks" — one, holy, catholic and apostolic
- The Church's unity finds its source and example in the unity of the three divine persons of the Trinity
- The Church shares one faith, one sacramental life, one hope, one Lord, one Spirit
- This one Church of Christ subsists in the Catholic Church, which the pope (the successor of Peter) and the bishops in communion with him govern
- The holiness of the Church comes from her divine source
- Christ has sanctified his Church so that she can be a source of sanctification and salvation
- The Church is the source of sanctification for all sinners; all are called to holiness
- The word "catholic" means universal
- The Church offers the fullness of salvation to all of humanity
- The Church is built of the foundation of the Apostles
- She guards and hands on the teaching of the Apostles
- She is taught, governed and sanctified by bishops, the successors of the Apostles, in communion with the pope, Peter's successor



**Feasts & Solemnities**

**JUNE 1: ST. JUSTIN, MARTYR**

St. Justin is one of the brilliant minds of the early Church (second century). He was one of the earliest writers to reflect on the compatibility of faith and reason. Eventually, he gave his life for the faith when he, along with six others, refused to offer sacrifice to Roman gods. He is referred to as Justin Martyr (the designation is often treated as if it was part of his name) and Justin the Philosopher.

**JUNE 3: ST. CHARLES LWANGA AND COMPANIONS, MARTYRS**

St. Charles Lwanga served in the Buganda royal household (modern Uganda). He and 21 others were put to death for resisting and protecting others from the abuses of the ruler. On the same day St. Joseph Mukasa Balikuddembe was being martyred by the Buganda ruler, Charles — still a catechumen — requested and received the sacrament of baptism. Like many martyrs, his feast day marks the day of his death in 1886.

**JUNE 5: ST. BONIFACE, BISHOP AND MARTYR**

St. Boniface is often called the "Apostle of Germany" and is known for his missionary work to the Germanic tribes. Although he was an English monk, he was sent by Pope Gregory II to evangelize in what would become parts of modern-day Germany and the Netherlands. St. Boniface is sometimes depicted with an axe, which is a reference to his chopping down of an oak tree that was worshipped by pagan followers of Thor. This is sometimes proposed as the "roots" of the Christmas tree tradition. St. Boniface was later martyred.

**JUNE 7: THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST**

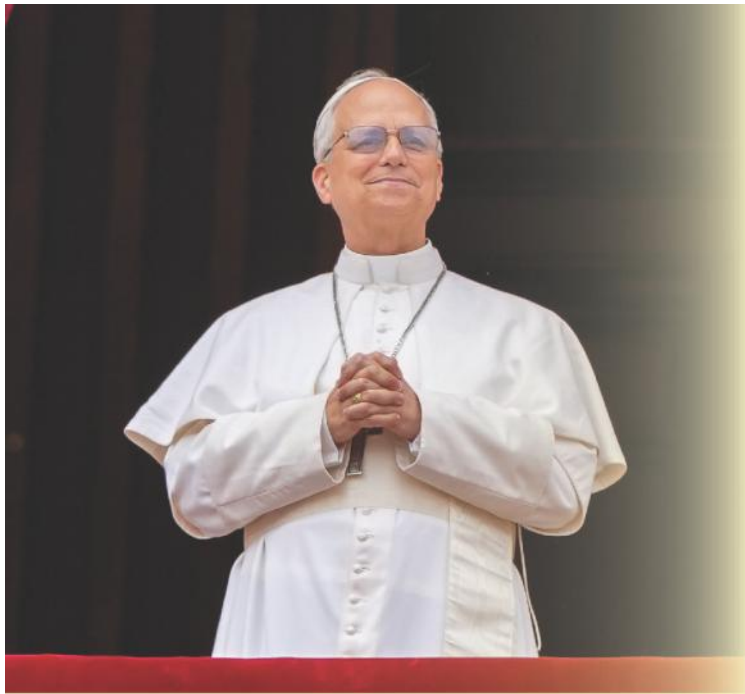
The celebration of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, often referred to simply by the Latin *Corpus Christi*, was established by Pope Urban IV in 1264 to celebrate Christ's love for us exhibited in his enduring presence in the Eucharist. The pope commissioned St. Thomas Aquinas to compose the Liturgy of the Hours for the feast. As part of this project, Aquinas composed several eucharistic hymns, portions of which are still widely used and well known today, such as *O Salutaris Hostia*, *Pange Lingua* (*Tantum Ergo* is a part of this hymn) and *Panis Angelicus*.

**JUNE 11: ST. BARNABAS, APOSTLE**

We encounter St. Barnabas in the Acts of the Apostles. We are told he was a Levite from Cyprus named Joseph and was given the name "Barnabas" (son of encouragement) when he came to the Apostles with a donation from some property he sold (Acts 4:36-37). He advocated for St. Paul with the Church in Jerusalem shortly after Paul's conversion (see Acts 9:27) and later was sent to Antioch and brought Paul there (see Acts 11:19-26). The two traveled and evangelized together on what is often referred to as Paul's first missionary journey (Acts 13-14) and are described in Scripture as "apostles" (Acts 14:14). The pair later split because of a disagreement (Acts 15:36-41 and Gal 2:13).

**JUNE 12: THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS**

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus centers on Christ's love for humanity. This love is ultimately seen in Jesus' willingness to suffer and die for us. Reflection on the wounded side of Christ goes back to the earliest times of the Church. Sacred Heart devotion was articulated in its current form due to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque's visions of Christ between 1673-1675. This devotion involves reflecting on the depth of Christ's love for us and seeking to respond with love modeled on his love. Divine Mercy devotion, which arose in the 20th century through the visions of St. Faustina Kowalska, is closely connected to devotion to the Sacred Heart.

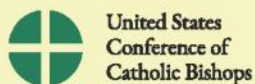

## What is Active Member Status in the Parish?

**Active member status means that the person is:**

- Registered in the parish
- Attends Mass weekly
- Supports the Parish through the consistent giving of time, talent, and/or financial resources in support of our Parish

**Why should a person have Active Member Status in our Parish?**

**Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:**

- Parishioner tuition in the school
- Attendance in Religious Education classes
- Letter of Eligibility to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation (see additional conditions below)
- Reception of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, or Marriage at our Church (unless specific permission is given)

**What are the requirements for being a Sacramental Sponsor (Godparent or Confirmation Sponsor)?**

**To be eligible to be a sacramental sponsor, a person must:**

- Be a Catholic who has received the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation. If these sacraments were not received at our Church, must provide a sacramental record from the Church of Baptism with Parish seal.
- Marital status of single or married according to the laws of the Catholic Church
- Have Active Member Status in the Parish as outlined above

## Is my Marriage Recognized by the Church?

Like other couples in your parish or family, you may be wondering if your marriage is fully recognized by the Catholic Church. Catholic Church law ordinarily requires baptized Roman Catholics to marry before a priest or deacon. Unless they received a **“dispensation from canonical form,”** Catholics who exchange vows in the presence of ministers from other religious traditions or civil officials are not considered validly married in the eyes of the Catholic Church.

Regardless of what happened in the past, the Catholic Church invites you to bring new meaning to your lives by embracing the vocation of marriage and dedicating your family’s mission to sharing God’s love.

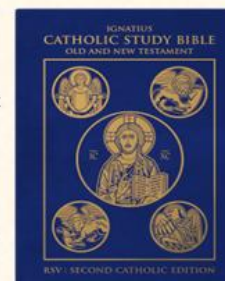
