

Character Analysis Book Report

Dear Parents,

We are about to begin our summer reading program! Students are encouraged to read at least 30 minutes a day. Please fill out the reading log to earn a special prize at the beginning of the year. Part of this program is completing 1 of the following assignments on The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe.

This project will help students with reading and time management skills. They will learn to take a more extensive assignment and break it into smaller, more manageable pieces. These skills will help your child grow in school with projects in almost any subject.

All students will need to complete this project is a copy of The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe by CS Lewis (guidelines listed below) and a computer or crafting supplies.

Students will need to complete their book projects at home over the summer and return this completed assignment the first week of school!

Choice 1:

- After reading or rereading The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe, students will be writing a detailed essay about the evolution of 1 character within the tale. This character may be of the student's choosing with the exception of choosing the character Mr. Tumnus as he is detailed below.

Example: Mr. Tumnus undergoes great change in the novel The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe by CS Lewis. In the beginning of this book when we are introduced to Mr. Tumnus, we believe him to be cordial and concerned only for the welfare of Lucy, daughter of Eve. This however was not the case! Mr. Tumnus was selfishly deceiving Lucy to receive a reward from the antagonist, the White Witch.

This example would continue to detail the changes Mr. Tumnus underwent and would include citations/quotes from the text to prove my analysis. This writing should be 5 paragraphs!

Choice 2:

- After reading or rereading the novel The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe by CS Lewis, students may create a diorama of their ideal "Narnia". This should include a clear infrastructure (food source, water, shelter, characters). This model should be **VERY** detailed and include 3 paragraphs detailing items placed within the model (specifically why each item was selected and why each is essential to the model).
